

## Millipedes Diplopoda sp.

## **Care Sheet**

**Average Size** 

1.5 - 11 inches long

Average Lifespan

1 - 3+ years

Diet

Millipedes will eat on decomposing wood, leaves, and fruits and vegetables. Pieces of cuttlebone are also recommended to provide needed calcium.

**Feeding** 

Millipedes are scavengers and prefer having food available at all times. Replace fruit and vegetables regularly to prevent fruit flies and mold growth.

Housing

**Habitat** - Few species are found in dry woodland or savannah type habitats, but most are found in tropical areas and need a moist substrate. Millipedes all live in dark, enclosed spaces and rarely venture out except for at night. Offer rotting logs, bark pieces and stones throughout the enclosure for hiding spaces.

**Size** - Millipedes can be kept in varying size enclosures from small plastic enclosures to larger glass enclosures depending on size of millipedes and number of millipedes in the enclosure.

**Substrate** - Millipedes like a moist, deep, soil substrate (peat, sphagnum, bark mulch) that will allow for them to burrow and properly molt.

**Temperature** - Temperatures between 60-78°F are perfect for Millipedes.

Humidity - Regular misting helps to keep humidity levels between 60-80%.

**Watering** - Some keepers will use a shallow water dish, although be careful of them potentially drowning.

**Lighting** - Millipedes do not need any specialized lighting. Lighting can be added for aesthetic purposes.
