Diet	Giant Waxy Monkey Tree Frogs are carnivores. They can be fed crickets, mealworms, wax worms, earth worms, roaches, and occasionally small rodents such as pinkie mice.
Feeding	Giant Waxy Monkey Tree Frogs should be fed 2-3 times a week. Dust food with calcium powder every feeding, & a multivitamin once a week.
Housing	Habitat - Giant Waxy Monkey Tree Frogs are found throughout the Amazon Rainforest and surrounding areas. Make sure that the enclosure has multiple hiding spots to reduce stress on the frog.
	Size - Baby Giant Waxy Monkey Tree Frogs can be kept in a 10-gallon enclosure. Giant Waxy Monkey Tree Frogs are extremely active frogs at night and require substantial amounts of space for adults. An adult tree frog requires at least a 20-gallon enclosure.
	Substrate - An absorbent substrate is desired. Peat moss, coconut fiber, reptile bark or sphagnum moss are suitable.
	Temperature - Giant Waxy Monkey Tree Frogs require a basking spot of 90° to 95° F.
	Humidity - Giant Waxy Monkey Tree Frogs humidity should remain at 40-60% due to their native climates. This can be maintained using a fogger, hand mister, or misting system.
	Watering - Giant Waxy Monkey Tree Frogs thrive in dryer environments. Misting their enclosure 2 - 3 times a week is sufficient. The frog will develop a waxy coating under the skin to store moisture. Always use de-chlorinated or bottled spring water.
	Lighting - Since this is a diurnal species, it requires two light bulbs. One is the heat lamp which also emits UVA. The second is a UVB lamp. The UVB lamp will specifically say UVB on the box. If the box doesn't say UVB, it's not UVB.
